II. President's Report

A. School Leadership Team (SLT) report

IV. Business

A. Recap of the meeting with Senator Addabo Jr.

25-30 parents showed up, demonstrating significant community support to school. Key Issues Presented to Senator Addabo:

- School Construction Delays:
 - o Parents asked for advocacy to expedite school construction, as students currently have recess indoors due to unfinished facilities.
- Aftercare Programs:
 - o Highlighted the need for expanded aftercare to accommodate the neighborhood's working families.
- Classroom Space vs. Teacher Shortage:
 - Although the school has unused classrooms, it cannot reduce class sizes to the 22-student cap due to a lack of teachers.
 - Parents asked for the Senator's help in securing more teaching staff.
- Budget Support for Extracurriculars:
 - Discussed the desire to expand the debate program, though funding remains a challenge.

Senator Dabo's Response and Engagement

- Commitment to Help: Senator Addabo showed interest in discussing these issues further with Dr. Lewis and offered potential solutions by involving others.
- School Tour:
 - a. Senator toured classrooms, including the teacher resource center and music room, participating briefly in music activities with students.
 - b. He appreciated both new and older parts of the building, acknowledging parents' concerns about unfinished areas.
- B. School Safety Committee Update
- Construction plans involve relocating trailers currently occupying the main playground area.
- Concerns exist about the perception of unused classrooms. When following the class size law, the existing classrooms are adequate, and no extra space is technically vacant.
- There is ongoing evaluation of how these spaces can be optimized to meet the specific needs of District 28 and the local community.
- C. Request for school dues

Raised money to fund the residency program. Each grade has a Residency program, and a Residency is an extracurricular. Usually arts inspired activity, such as dancing or ballet. And different bills that we have to pay, such as help the school buy books or art supply, on Teacher Appreciation Day, being able to supply the teachers with a luncheon, and also kosher luncheon

F. Residencies

- G. School Residencies Overview:
 - a. Ms. Bryant reached out to the PA regarding available funds for residencies. Standard residencies, like "Circle of Dance" for grades 1-3, occur annually
 - b. A meeting with Ms. Karachi and Ms. Bryant is planned to confirm the residencies for this year.
- H. Transparency in Budgeting for Residencies:
 - a. Last year, some budgeted activities didn't occur, leading to unused funds.
 - b. Future planning would benefit from a confirmed list of residencies to map the year's financial needs accurately.
- I. Summary of Previous Residency Programs and Costs:
 - a. Nutcracker Ballet (4th grade): \$1,400 with New York City Ballet
 - b. Circle of Dance (K-2): \$5,000 for three grades
 - c. Debate Program (5th grade): Budgeted at \$100 but cost \$5,000
 - d. Ballroom Dancing (5th grade): Approx. \$3,000
 - e. Concerns About Cost Changes:
 - Some residency costs fluctuate due to grants or subsidies from the school or city, but these changes were not communicated to the PA in advance.
 - g. The PA emphasized the need for better coordination with the administration to avoid unexpected bills.
- J. Action Items
 - a. Follow-up with School Administration: to get a confirmed list of residencies and their associated costs.
 - b. Improved Communication: Request the school to notify the PA promptly of any changes in residency costs to avoid unexpected financial adjustments.
